## WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

Using case presentations with commonly encountered clinical aspects, present how treatment would look different in the following 4 systems:

1. VA clinic,
2. Military clinic,
3. CMHC clinic, and
4. Solo clinician.

Should there be a guideline of universal treatment recommendations and structure?

If so, what would be the common elements? Should there be a core competency training for clinicians? What aspects of treatment are incompatible with military employment? Cases will be created to outline examples.

## LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Introduce participants to military cultures, traditions, and courtesies
2. Understand the Judge-Advocate-General regulations regarding drug and alcohol use and abuse among active and reserve military components
3. Learn how past and recent trends of drug and alcohol use in the military differs from national trends
4. Understand how recent drug and alcohol trends in the military contribute to recent suicide rates in the military
5. Consider training implications for medical students, psychiatry resident training programs, and addiction psychiatry and addiction medicine fellowships

## TRAINER

**Dr. John Rodolico** is presently the Chief of Behavioral Health for the Massachusetts National Guard. He has given numerous presentations, group consultations and trainings on adolescent addictions, motivational aspects of addiction treatment, and resiliency with military personnel. He has extensive experience with adolescent addiction that spans over 25 years. After completing his post-doctoral work in addiction psychology Dr. Rodolico has been committed to using evidence-based treatments to help people with addictive disorders across the life span. He has participated in numerous randomized clinical trials as both a supervising clinician and therapist. His many areas of research includes motivational psychology, evidence-based treatments for dual diagnosed patients, and epidemiology of adolescent addictive disorders. Dr. Rodolico also has an extensive teaching history over the past two decades, supervising clinical psychology interns, post-doctoral fellows and child and adolescent psychiatry fellows.

## DIRECTIONS TO WESTFIELD STATE UNIVERSITY

### From the Mass Pike

1. Take Exit 3 (Westfield).
2. Turn right onto routes 10/202 South, travel for about two miles through town.
