WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

“There are many pathways of long-term recovery, and all are cause for celebration!”

Recovery means different things to different people. There is no single path of recovery that is a fit for everyone. In this workshop we will discuss the contemporary understanding of substance use disorder and examine the differences between addiction treatment and recovery. We will explore the foundation of recovery and the multiple means through which recovery can be cultivated and supported. Current recovery research will be reviewed demonstrating the efficacy of many alternative pathways to sustaining recovery. This workshop presents an appreciation for a new paradigm, a broader acceptance of personal recovery choices, and the power of interpersonal connection.

The Recovery Research Institute is a leading nonprofit research institute of Massachusetts General Hospital, an affiliate of Harvard Medical School, dedicated to the advancement of addiction treatment & recovery. Trainers

Linda Sarage, M.A., M.Ed., Lead Trainer

Linda Sarage has been in recovery for over 35 years and is a passionate advocate for the peer recovery movement. Linda is the former director of the RECOVER Project, a peer recovery support center in Greenfield, MA. She has supported recovery coaching statewide with BSAS and is a lead trainer for the Recovery Coach Academy and Ethical Considerations for Recovery Coaches. She provides technical assistance to recovery community organizations locally and nationally. Linda is the director of the Addiction Recovery Coach Certificate program at Westfield State University.

Peter Babineau, Co-Trainer

Peter Babineau is the Western Massachusetts Regional Manager for Learn2Cope, a statewide non-profit peer-led support network for families dealing with addiction and recovery. Peter also worked as manager, counselor, substance use educator, curriculum coordinator and most recently as the substance use educator supervisor for the Sheriff's Department. He retired from that position in April of 2018. Peter previously served as co-chair of the Hampden County Addiction Task Force. Peter is a long-time advocate for harm reduction and has worked and focused much of his energies on working with people with opioid use disorder and their families.

DIRECTIONSTO WESTFIELDSTATEUNIVERSITY

From the Mass Pike

1. Take Exit 3 (Westfield).
2. Turn right onto routes 10/202 South, travel for about two miles through town.
3. To the Westfield Public Library (on your right).
4. Turn right onto Court street/Western Ave. for 2.5 miles.
5. Westfield State Univ. is on your right.

From Springfield

1. Take Route 20 into Westfield.
2. Take left on Main St.
